#### **POINTS OF DEPARTURE**

- DPR 2011 requested the DPCG meeting to discuss and agreed on the future DPAF targets for FY 2011/12-2012/13.
- Despite the absence of global targets beyond 2010 post Busan, there are already joint agreements made at country level, including:
  - Rwanda Aid Policy
  - Kigali Statement of Action
- Several indicators will require joint aspiration as to where we want to go, how far and how fast we would like to achieve.
- Aggregate future DPAF targets are to be applied as individual aggregate targets.
- No target is to be set below PD targets of 2010.
