4 Key lessons: What we shall build on...

- ▶ **Working together – with participation of population** (e.g. Fast tracking 9YBE, Agriculture CIP, Health achievements) – **it has proven cost effective and rapid**
- ▶ **Many home-grown initiatives turning into success stories**
- ▶ **Putting in place the adequate institutional/ legal framework** for implementation –(e.g. RDB, REB, EWSA, etc.)
- ▶ **Improved service delivery where ICT has been well mainstreamed** (e.g. Immigration services, business registration, financial sector, IFMIS, etc.)
- ▶ **Ownership of and alignment** of resources have made the EDPRS a useful guiding strategy

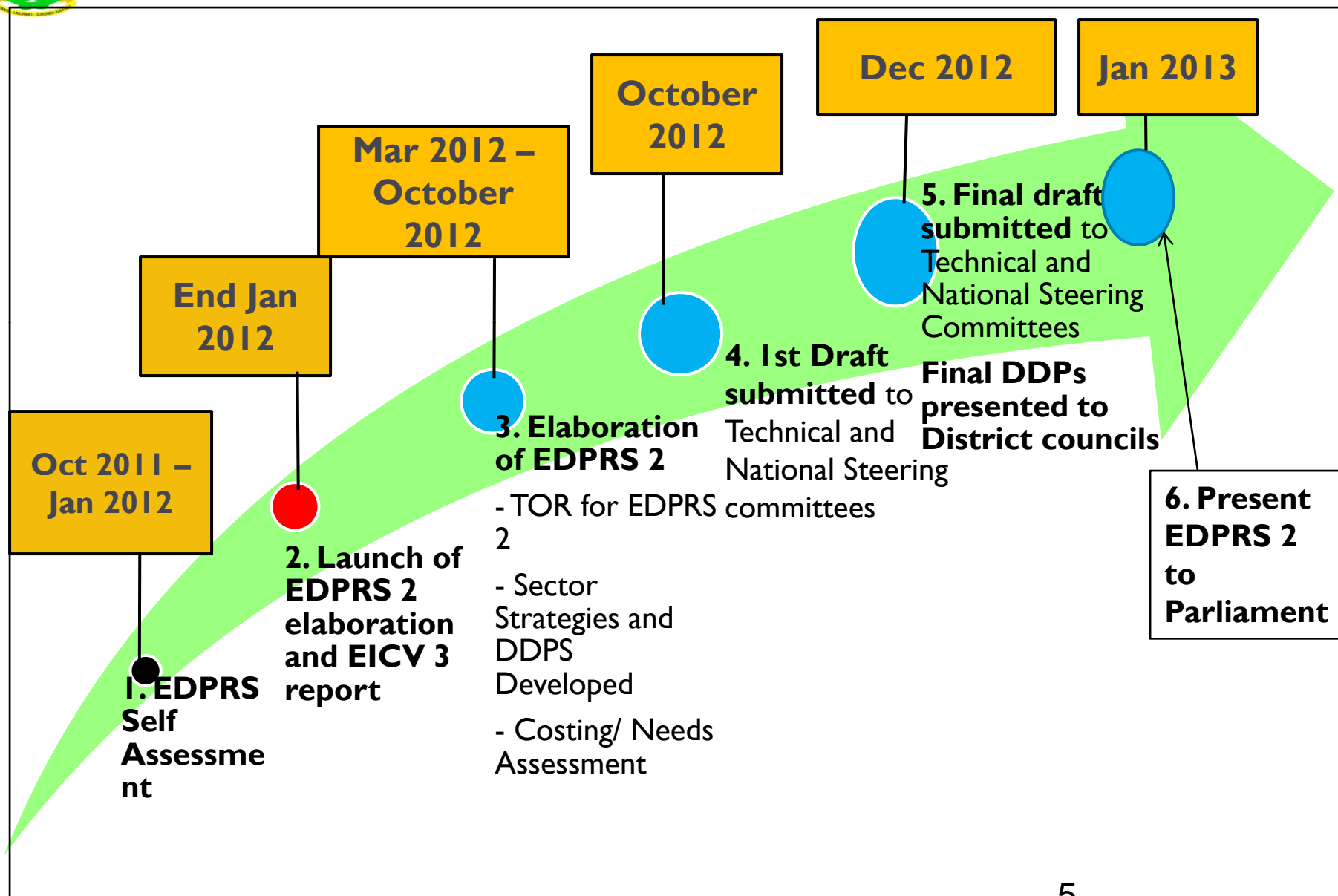


5 Key lessons: What we can do better...

- ▶ **Some areas still lack exhaustive/ well articulated strategies**
- ▶ **Some structures are still not functioning as expected, (e.g. JADF, Transport sector coordination, etc.) - more reforms needed**
- ▶ **We could have done better on mainstreaming cross-cutting issues + regional integration**
- ▶ **Insufficient involvement of private sector/ cooperatives (NGOs/CSOs) in some areas**
- ▶ **We can improve on M&E in many areas**
