Principles and Renewed Commitments

- 4th High-Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness in Busan major turning point for aid agenda
 - Places centrality of achieving development results at the heart of global aid/development cooperation dialogue
 - High-political level engagement of Africa and other partner countries (President of Rwanda, Prime Minister of Ethiopia, Vice President from Burundi)
 - Forges new inclusive global partnership
 - Aid as catalytic for development: development driven by strong, sustainable and inclusive growth, greater role for domestic revenues, effective institutions, regional and global integration



Principles and Renewed Commitments

- Shared Principles for Inclusive partnership (Busan Outcome Document)
 - Ownership of development policies by developing countries. Partnerships led by developing countries, implementing approaches tailored to country-specific situations and needs
 - ▶ Focus on Results lasting impact on eradicating poverty and reducing inequality, on sustainable development, and on enhancing developing countries capacities, aligned with priorities and policies set out by developing countries
 - Inclusive development partnerships openness, trust, mutual respect and learning at the core of effective partnership, recognising the different and complementary roles of all actors
 - ▶ Transparency and accountability mutual and domestic accountability critical to delivering results. Transparent practices form the basis for enhanced accountability.

Principles and Renewed Commitments

Commitments

- Unfinished aid effectiveness agenda to be fully implemented
- Developing countries' efforts and plans to strengthen core institutions and policies supported through approaches that aim to manage risk;
- Transparent, country-led and country-level results frameworks and platforms adopted as a common tool for performance assessment.
- Accelerate efforts to until aid
- Use of country systems as the default approach
- Accelerating and deepen commitments to strengthen role of parliaments, local governments, CSOs

Principles and Commitments

Transparency – full range of information, common open standard for electronic publication of timely, comprehensive and forward looking information

- Improve medium-term predictability (rolling three-to five-indicative forward spending plans)
- Greater use of country-led coordinating arrangements (DoL, PBAs, Joint programming, delegated cooperation);
- Fuller use of South-South and Triangular cooperation;
- Increased private sector participation in development policies and strategies;
- Promoting aid for trade, further developing innovative financing mechanisms



Post Busan Global Framework

Global-Light, Country-Heavy

- Frameworks based on national needs and priorities for monitoring progress and promoting mutual accountability agreed at country level;
- Selective and relevant set of indicators and targets for monitoring progress on a rolling basis to support international and regional accountability for the implementation of commitments.
- New inclusive and representative Global partnership for Effective Development Cooperation to be established, supporting and ensuring accountability at the political level;
- Post-Busan Interim Group (PBIG) as a temporary arrangements to facilitate agreement on the post-Busan Global Framework by June 2012.



Rwanda Implementation of Post-Busan Agenda

- Core of the post-Busan follow-up through ongoing EDPRS II Process –
 Development policies and results monitoring
- ▶ Country level monitoring framework Building on CPAF and DPAF framework, strengthen the results and accountability framework;
- Expanding scope of development partnership framework inclusive development cooperation dialogue, new partners to DPAF process;
- Inclusive joint programming, enhancing PBAs, development cooperation architecture
