Rwanda,


- 58th in the world
- Leads all EAC
- 4th in SSA

Rwanda, is the second global reformer in 2011

Performance of EAC countries

Rwanda is the front runner in the region with a big jump in reforms in DB10


Ghana made considerable progress with 5 reforms in DB08.

Mauritius reformed its regulations at a steady pace from DB07 to DB10

Zambia made more progress recently and is among the DB11 top reforming economies

Tanzania mainly improved its business regulatory environment in DB07.

(1)Starting a business

- 1 procedure for registration
- Online registration

(2) Construction Permits

- Establishment of One Stop Center
- Enactment of Prime Minister Instructions regarding implementation of Client Charter
- Water and electricity Connections done in less than 5 days

(3) Registering property

- Reduction of time taken when confirming property ownership to less than 10 days
- Elimination of preparation of sale contract

(4) Getting Credit

- Establishment of Private Credit Reference bureau with utilities, insurance and retail loans
- Make improvements to BNR public reference bureau to include information that is beyond 2 years

(5)Trade across borders

- Harmonization of Customs procedures with EAC
- Introduction of 24 hour border operations
- Removal of release cargo order as a trade document
- Establish integrated border management (RBS, Customs, Immigration)

(6) Paying taxes

- Quarterly paying of VAT
- Installation of software to calculate taxes and fines
- Online tax registration/declaration

Beyond DB indicators :Legal Framework reforms

- Company law amended
- Mortgage law amended and published in the official gazette
- Electronic Signature, messaging and transaction law
- Condominium law
- Valuation law
- Credit Information Systems law
- Holding and Circulation of securities
